Open for use by residents and property owners (with residential properties, including seasonal)



Permit Stickers are required – see Policy and Application Form WRC-2

- Attendants are on duty to assist with placement locations for all items. Attendants are there to monitor the operation.
- If any citizen has concerns about the Recycling Center, please contact the Board of Selectmen at 603 399-4471.
- No commercial dumping or disposal or waste generated outside the Town is allowed.
- **PLEASE see attendant first** prior to disposing of items such as demo materials, bulky furniture items, major appliances or metal.

RECYCLING

WHAT IS RECYCLING?

Recycling is a process by which waste products, such as glass, aluminum cans, paper and corrugated cardboard are collected separately and sold to help offset the cost of disposal of the solid waste.

Less Landfills means better water quality!

WHY RECYCLE?

Recycling reduces the amount of solid waste to be disposed. This translates into saved dollars. Every ton of solid waste recycled is one less ton that must be buried in a landfill or burned in a waste incinerator. We know that recycling can reduce the amount of trash we throw away by one-half. Recycling preserves precious land resources by decreasing the need for more and larger landfills.

WHAT TO RECYCLE

GROUP 1: NEWSPRINT/PAPER

Newspaper Egg Cartons Junk Mail Envelopes Magazines
Inserts Telephone Books Glossy Cardboard (cereal boxes, etc.)
Office & Scrap Paper (white or colored)

Please separate newspaper from slippery & other papers. We stack newsprint to get as much paper in the container as possible to save money and other papers mixed in with newsprint create landslides!

GROUP 2: CARDBOARD

Corrugated cardboard – broken down & flattened

GROUP 3: CO-MINGLE

- All plastic labeled with a recycle symbol
- Metal cans – please rinse clean & **crush**
- Glass: remove lids, rinse & clean. Labels can stay on.
- Milk jugs & detergent bottles must be **crushed**

No broken glass, light bulbs, window glass, mirrors, fish tanks, dishes, glass cookware, ceramics or other glass items.

REMINDER: Crushing plastic & cans saves hauling charges

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS ACCEPTED AT NO CHARGE:

- Compostable garden waste
- Brush & tree limbs up to 5" in diameter
- Burnable building material scraps (non-painted, non-pressure treated)
- Latex paint is acceptable only if it is dried. It may then be disposed of in the compactor.

ITEMS ACCEPTED AT EXTRA COST

- Appliances & Bulky furniture \$20
- Non Burnable building material \$30 per yard
- Misc. items such as scrap metal, fans, grills, etc., cost at discretion of attendant
- Refrigerators \$20 if Freon is removed; \$25 IF NOT
- Lawn mowers & bicycles \$5

KEENE RECYCLING CENTER ACCEPTS THE FOLLOWING:

(Fee will be charged)

- Large volumes of fluorescent light bulbs
- Batteries (including large volumes of flashlight and car batteries)
- Oil based paints
- Paint Thinners
- Cleaning products, Pesticides
- Propane Gas Tanks
- Dead animals
- Waste oil, hydraulic oil
- Any Liquid Materials not stated
- Car tires (16"), Truck tires
- TVs and computer monitors
